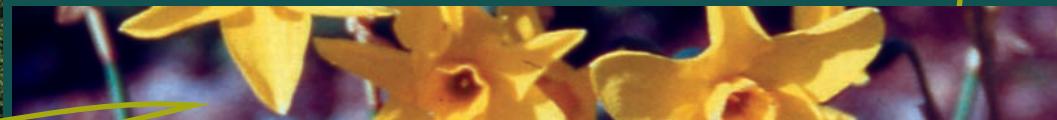

Redbrow Garden Information

Introduction

Initiated in 1997, this relatively large rural garden has been designed and developed by David and Elisabeth Judge to be more than aesthetically pleasing to the eye and uplifting for the soul. With the clear spring waters of Coots Creek as the centrepiece, it provides seasonal lifecycle masterpieces of colour, motion and tranquillity against a backdrop of remnant native woodland. Of the more than 9 hectares (approx 20 acres), many areas of the garden feature potentially viable alternative small farm enterprises as well as providing informative ideas for landscaping larger rural blocks.

Named after the numerous native 'Redbrowed Firetail' finches (*Emblema temporalis*) which inhabit the garden, spectacular seasonal formations are provided by 40,000 daffodils of over 30 varieties, hundreds of ornamental and productive fruit trees and 20,000 native and exotic trees and shrubs inter planted with colourful perennials, annuals and other assorted bulbs. The garden also incorporates an interesting corrugated iron family home, ensuite B&B accommodation, a small group meetings venue, horse and alpaca paddocks, free range chooks, aviaries, plant nursery, organic vegetable garden and in season 'pick your own' strawberries, black and red currants, raspberries, blueberries and gooseberries.

Initial tree plantings resulted from the purchase of 20,000 native tubestock from a closing wholesale native plant nursery. (We went there for advice and 20 trees!!!) The tubestock were ideal- locally propagated, hardened and of species suitable for local soil and climatic conditions and attractive to a myriad of native bird species.

No formal plans or timetables have been drawn up (everything done however has been recorded) and the garden has simply evolved spontaneously, using whatever plants became available at an affordable price, extensive mulching and utilising that ever decreasing commodity - time. In 2000, we purchased the entire stock of a closing retail nursery. The majority of plants were advanced ornamental deciduous trees and bare rooted fruit trees.

The garden is bisected by a spectacular spring fed lake, a thriving wetland habitat for aquatic life including numerous water birds. Opportunities for bird watching abound throughout the garden due to suitable habitat creation.

Situated on Nanima Road (off the Barton Highway) between the historic village of Hall in the ACT and the emerging cool climate wineries around Murrumbateman in NSW, the garden is only 12 kilometres from the highway and 20 minutes drive from Australia's national capital, Canberra.

'Redbrow Garden' is open for seasonal berry picking and garden visitation and during regular organised field days to provide information on alternative small farm enterprises and landscaping ideas for relatively large rural blocks in the region.

Due to the potential hazards of a working farm and associated farm activities, children are encouraged to visit during special educational days developed for their benefit. Children visiting with parents or guardians need to be fully supervised at all times as a condition of entry.

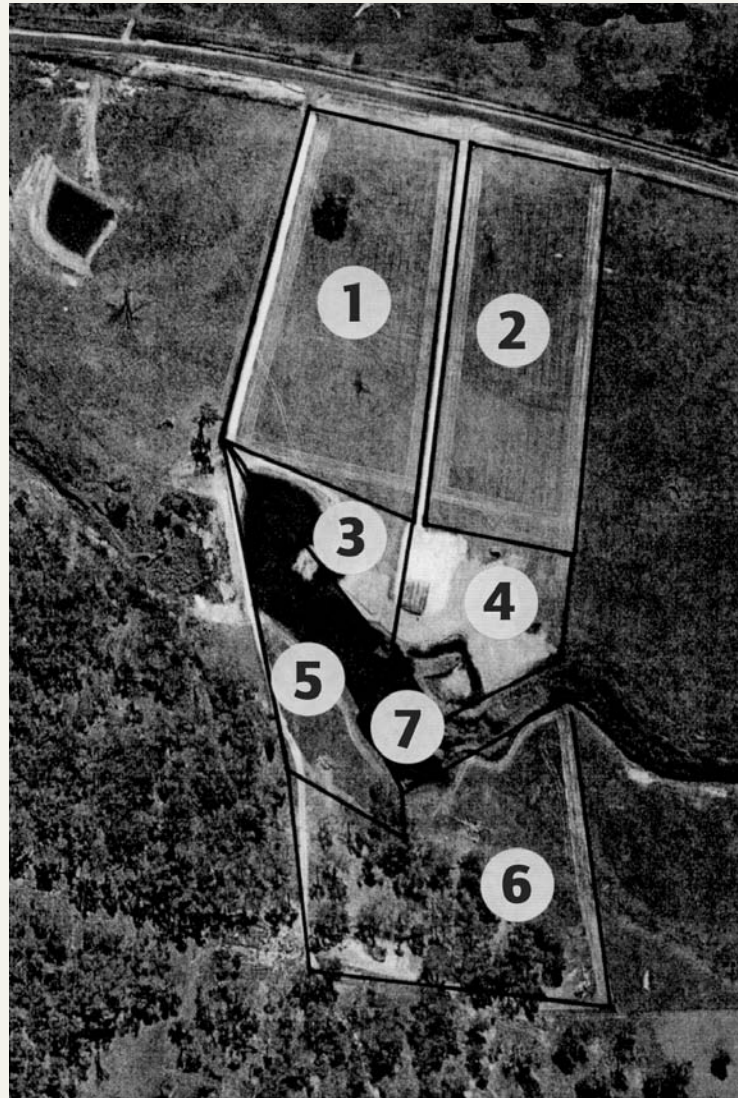
